

How to Overseed Your Lawn

1. Spray out weeds with herbicide. If using a broadleaf selective herbicide you will need to wait a minimum of two weeks before sowing new seed.
2. Mow the existing lawn closely.
3. Rake or scarify the lawn to remove and break up the layers of dead matted grass or thatch.
4. If the ground is compacted, loosen it up by spiking with a fork to a depth of at least 15cm. This will improve root growth and drainage.
5. Before sowing seed apply Landscape Range 'Kickstart' starter fertiliser. This ensures fast germination and establishment.
6. Spread seed out evenly over entire lawn at recommended rate, we recommend using an Earthway spreader.
7. Keep seed constantly damp and do not overwater. Water is the most important part of any new lawn.
8. Once seed has germinated allow to grow to around 40-50mm, then mow to around 30mm. Mow regularly, trying not to remove more than a third of growth at any time.



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
